

**2012 Texas 4-H Shooting Sports Extravaganza
April 21, 2012**

This is a beginner's match only. Rules are adjusted to accommodate this being a beginner's match.
These rules are for Extravaganza only! Rules for any other match do not apply at this event!

The **28th Annual Texas 4-H Shooting Sports Extravaganza** will take place at the Texas 4-H Conference Center on Lake Brownwood. Qualification is not required. This is an open match for beginner shooters requiring only basic knowledge of safety, rules and format required. The emphasis is on fun and exploring new shooting activities, so shooters are encouraged to try new events as time permits. Space and time limit us to a maximum of 400 participants.

This is not intended to be a match for our top level shooters, but an introduction to competitive shooting for beginners. Advanced shooters are encouraged to participate as coaches or mentors for younger, less experienced shooters.

AGE CLASSES:

Three age classes will be recognized with all ages determined *as of 31 August 2011*. Not their age when you fill out the form.

Junior	9 (or 8 and in the 3 rd grade) -10
Intermediate	11-13
Senior	14-18

DISCIPLINES OFFERED:

Extravaganza has its own set of rules - please make sure you read them. The rules for the State Games or any other shooting venue do not apply at Extravaganza.

Sixteen events will be featured. They are:

- BB gun
- Sporter 3-Pos. air rifle (Jrs will shoot 2 prone only)
- Precision air rifle (standing only)
- Running target
- Light rifle
- 3-position smallbore rifle
- Junior prone smallbore rifle (ages 8-10 only)
- Smallbore rifle silhouette
- Air pistol
- Air pistol silhouette
- Air rifle silhouette
- Compound basic archery
- Recurve basic archery
- Compound 3-D archery
- Recurve 3-D archery
- Skeet (This is a separate event)
- Trap (This is a separate event)
- Sporting clays (This is a separate event)
- Hunting medley (hunter decision making, hunting skills, wildlife identification and management; no live fire)

Only entry level shooters may fire in the shotgun matches. Shotgun was separated starting in 2011 into three separate events and, it was a major success, so we will be keeping this format.

***** PLEASE NOTE: If a shooter signs up for shotgun, the shooter can participate in two shotgun events. The shooter will not be allowed to shoot a non-shotgun event due to the distance between the shotgun range and the other disciplines.**

Note that silhouette events are not completely squadded and may require either the morning or the afternoon at a remote site.

SATURDAY MORNING ARRIVALS:

Those arriving on Saturday morning must plan on arriving by 7:00 AM in order to clear registration and get their packets prior to the 8:00 AM orientation. Only the coach or leader responsible for the county/club delegation may check in with:
1) 4-H Conference Center Office to ensure that all visitors, coaches and observers are registered.
2) Shooting Sports Registration. This ensures that competitors have arrived and are registered to shoot in the appropriate events.

ORIENTATION:

Orientation will begin at 8:00 AM SHARP on Saturday and is REQUIRED for EVERYONE! IF needed, the orientation will be split between the auditorium and the dining hall.

REGISTRATION AND SQUADDING: Registration is to be completed by county coach, **NOT** individual participants.

DEADLINE: March 21 on 4-H Connect!

Registration will be made online at 4-H Connect only. This includes: 1) event sign-up for shooters, 2) meals, 3) lodging at 4-H Center and 4) visitor day use fee. 4-H CONNECT HAS A NO REFUND POLICY! There is no late registration and NO ON-SITE REGISTRATION.

Registration is to be completed by county coach, <u>NOT</u> individual participants. Range space and time constraints place limits on the number of participants in all matches. Only two events will be squadded, per shooter using alternates, if needed. Time and space permitting, shooters may participate in other events for FUN only. Scores for these will NOT be entered in the statistical office and will not show up in the results bulletin.

At the event, each shooter will be given a squad card indicating their events and shoot times. Unless actively engaged in another squadded event, shooters should report to the appropriate location approximately 30 to 45 minutes prior to their scheduled time. Conflicts should be cleared with event coordinators. Shooters missing their appointed shooting times may be rotated to the end of the shooting day if time permits and the shoot coordinator approves the rotation.

Permission to make up a missed event is NOT guaranteed!

KNOWLEDGE OF THE MATCH:

Although this is a beginners' match, we are pressed for time in nearly all events. **It is essential that all shooters understand the rules and basic skills in each discipline in which they are to shoot.** Preliminary introduction to rules and skills by a local coach is essential for shooters to have a positive experience at the match. Rules are posted on the Texas 4-H Shooting Sports web page (<http://texas4-h.tamu.edu/natural>) then click Shooting Sports in the right hand menu box) and a brief summary of the events is attached to this announcement.

The 4-H Conference Center requires all persons (including adults) to complete the 4-H Conference Center Release Forms (2 pages) and submit them at Registration on Saturday, April 21. (DO NOT MAIL - BRING WITH YOU ON APRIL 21!)

CHALLENGES:

Shooters may view targets as soon as they come available for one hour after they are made available. Junior shooters (ages 8-10) may have ONE adult/coach/older 4-Her with them while viewing. Intermediate and senior shooters can view their targets by themselves only. A target may be challenged if the shooter feels that it has been scored incorrectly. Fee to challenge is \$1.00. No fee is charged to correct stat office errors.

PROTESTS:

Shooters ONLY may file a protest for any injustice, violation of the rules, or other circumstance that may have results in placing them at a disadvantage relative to other shooters. Such conditions must be reported to the range officer or field referee immediately. If satisfaction is not obtained, the situation should be reported immediately to the event manager. The shooter ONLY has the right to file a written protest with a \$20 protest fee within 1 hour of time their squad has finished. The jury will investigate and reach final resolution of the matter as soon as possible.

FAN INTERFERENCE:

Disruption by parents, coaches or other individuals will not be permitted. Sanctions ranging from a warning to ejection from the grounds or disqualification will be imposed for interference with the operation of the match or disruption of the events on a firing line or field. The "Little League Syndrome" will not be tolerated in 4-H Shooting Sports. Every effort will be made to keep these events fair, kid centered and positive. "Fighting for my kid(s) is neither necessary, nor permitted."

PERSONAL GEAR:

In general shooters provide their own firearms, ammunition and archery equipment as well as personal eye and ear protection.

- A limited number of air rifles, air pistols, smallbore rifles, and shotguns are available for those who wish to try these events but do not have personal arms. These are very limited.
- Equipment will be provided on the running target range.
- Only .177 air guns may be used in air rifle and air pistol events.
- Sharing equipment poses problems for some events, as a result no more than two (2) shooters may share a rifle or pistol AND their need to share equipment MUST be noted on the shooter registration form. Two shooters CANNOT share a .22 rifle in both silhouette and either 3-position or light rifle. The silhouette range is off-site, so the rifles will not be available to on-site shooters. Follow the registration instructions to designate the shooters and the equipment that will be shared. Give each rifle or pistol being shared a number, (e.g. #1, #2, etc.), to identify the shooters sharing it. THIS CANNOT BE DONE ON THE DAY OF

THE EVENT!

- Adding shooters after squadding has been completed is not possible. A shooter may, however, try something new if an opening comes available on a squad.
- We recommend storing your equipment in a locked vehicle.

Both the Texas and National 4-H Shooting Sports Programs are on record as being opposed to any games that involve shooting at another individual or at humanoid targets. Thus, water balloon launchers, air soft guns, paintball guns, marshmallow guns or similar items are not permitted on the grounds. If they are seen, they will be confiscated and disposed of by shoot management! This means that they will **NOT** be returned.

SAFETY:

The highest standards of safety must be maintained at all times. To help us in achieving that end, the following rules apply:

1. All firearms must have an action open indicator in the action at all times except when on the firing line. Either commercial or handmade Indicators may be used.
2. Semi-automatic and tubular magazine rifles must be loaded with a single cartridge at a time.
3. Users of semi-automatic firearms are responsible for keeping ejected brass from interfering with others.
4. No practice or off-range shooting is permitted using any equipment in any location on the day of the event.
5. Firearms, ammunition and archery equipment is to be kept under direct adult supervision at all times.
6. Firearms, archery equipment and ammunition are not permitted in the dorms.
7. Adequate eye and ear protection is REQUIRED for all persons on or in the immediate vicinity of the firing line for all 4-H shooting events during live firing. This includes spectators who are close to the firing line. EXCEPTIONS: Ear protection is not required in the air rifle and air pistol events. Neither eye nor ear protection is required in the archery events, but the use of protective eye wear is strongly encouraged.
8. Event coordinators and range staff are in absolute control of their respective ranges. Their commands must be obeyed immediately and completely.
9. The use of hand loaded ammunition must be approved in advance of use. Hand loaded ammunition for any event must be accompanied by the appropriate forms as found on the Texas 4-H Shooting Sports website (shootingsports.tamu.edu) with clear proof of certification from the NRA to load ammunition of that type.
10. All equipment must be cased when brought to the firing line. One case per gun.
11. Each end of the case must be marked saying "Muzzle End" or "Butt End."
12. Some assistance may be needed with particular venues for added safety reasons. Your willingness to help as needed is appreciated.

SHOOTING EVENTS, COURSES OF FIRE AND SHOOT LOCATIONS:

This is a beginner's match only. Rules are adjusted to accommodate this being a beginner's match. These rules are for Extravaganza only! Rules for any other match do not apply at this event!

The attached materials include an outline for each event. Please review those events which your shooters have selected. Note that the silhouette events are held at sites off the 4-H Center property and may require up to ½ day. **Shotgun will be considered an all-day event.** Squadding times for these events are approximate and indicate either morning or afternoon squads which will be made up on site. Each county or club must provide adequate transportation and adult leaders to get shooters to the proper locations.

SATURDAY EVENING AWARDS CEREMONY:

The Awards Ceremony will be held after all the matches are complete and final results have been tabulated. The time for the awards ceremony will be announced. Workshops, in-service training opportunities, and exhibits or displays provided by sponsors, co-operators, state training team members, coaches or teen leaders willing to share their ideas, tips and techniques during the day Saturday are strongly encouraged. A schedule will be provided once confirmations have been

received. Contact the State 4-H Natural Resources Office (tx4hnaturalresources@tamu.edu) if you are interested in sharing a seminar or demonstration.

All participants receive a 2011 4-H Shooting Sports Extravaganza patch. In addition, the top places in each class and age group will receive plaques to recognize their achievement. Where numbers are sufficient to form Lewis Classes, Lewis Class awards will be included determinant upon numbers of shooters registered in each event at the end of the official registration period. Award structure will be fixed at that time. Award numbers and distribution will NOT change to reflect late registration!

In all events, awards will be provided commensurate with the enrollment in each age group at the time of that pre-registration closes. These numbers will determine both the number of classes in each age class and event and the total number of awards. Scratch or A-class awards will be limited as follows: 1 shooter - no award, 2 -3 shooters - 1 award, 4-5 shooters - 2 awards, 6 or more shooters - 3 awards. Lewis classes will be defined by total enrollment in each event and age class at the time pre-registration ends.

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANCE NEEDED:

As in the past, some help will be needed on ranges, in the scoring area, in the target review area, and as couriers during the day Saturday. Volunteers who give their time on the ranges will be recognized with special caps to designate their service. If you received a blue volunteer cap in the past and are willing to help again, we ask that you bring your cap with you.

If you are willing to help, please Beverly Sullivan (Sullivan@centex.net) to help us locate you early. We need at least one volunteer from each county to help when they have some available time. Teen are encouraged to assist as well.

This is the 28th ANNUAL TEXAS 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS EXTRAVAGANZA. We expect it to continue in the traditions of the earlier ones, bringing FUN, FELLOWSHIP AND NEW IDEAS to shooting sports youth, parents and leaders. Come and join us in making this event special! We look forward to seeing you there.

Please note the changes to the 2012 event as highlighted in red.

Air Pistol Match

Location: Texas 4-H Center - Recreation Room, Main Building
Targets: B-32 four bull
Courses of Fire: All firing will be at 10 meters (33 feet), ten (10) shots per target
Junior - ten (10) shots, two-hand hold, **heel of the hand support only (no other point of contact)** (3.3.4 shots per bull)
Intermediate - twenty (20) shots, two-hand hold, standing (5 shots per bull)
Senior - thirty (30) shots, one-hand hold, standing (5 shots per bull)
Equipment: **Pistol Permission Slip is required to participate.**
Any safe caliber .177 (4.5 mm) air pistol with metallic or equivalent sights may be used. Some pistols and pellets will be available, but competitors are urged to bring their own equipment. **If you need to use our equipment, please indicate your needs on the registration form to aid in squadding.**
Time: A total of one (1) minute per record shot. Sighters are permitted on the designated bull. Relays are scheduled on 45 MINUTE intervals.

Air Pistol Silhouette Match

Location: Woodmen of the World Silhouette Range
Targets: 1/10 Scale Metallic Silhouettes
Course of Fire:

Equipment: **Pistol Permission Slip is required to participate. Open, non-aperture sights. No electronic or telescopic devices.**
Any safe caliber .177 (4.5 mm) air pistol with metallic or equivalent sights may be used. Some pistols and pellets will be available, but competitors are urged to bring their own equipment. **If you need to use our equipment, please indicate your needs on the registration form to aid in squadding.**
Time: Thirty second "**Ready**" time and two and one-half (2 ½) minute shooting time for each bank of 5 targets.

BB Gun Match

Location: Tennis Courts or patio, depending upon weather
Targets: NRA AR-4/10
Course of Fire: **One match of** (4) ten-shot stages of prone, standing, sitting, and kneeling for a total of 40 record shots will be fired from a distance of 5 meters (16 feet 4 3/4 inches).
Eligible Ages: Only **Juniors** and **Intermediates** are eligible for this match.
Equipment: Any safe, factory smoothbore BB gun weighing a total of six (6) pounds or less may be used. Only metallic sights may be used. Rear sights with eyecups and any hooded front site that extends beyond the muzzle may not be used. Blinders are permitted.
Match Supervisor: Wally Hess, Humble, TX

Basic Archery Compound and Recurve Matches

Ties: Ties will be broken in three stages: totals in rams, turkeys, pigs and chickens; long runs in the same order, shoot offs using paper targets and air rifles on the air pistol range.

Equipment: 4-H Air Rifle Silhouette rules apply.
Any safe air rifle weighing no more than 11 pounds with scopes and mounts attached.
Length of barrel and action must not exceed 30 inches.
Rifles may be powered by compressed air or CO2.
Calibers permitted include .177 (5MM), .22 or .25.
Gloves are not allowed.
No slings or palm rests allowed.

Coaching: Each shooter may have a coach or spotter on the firing line with a scope or binoculars to call shots, keep time and advise. They may not touch the shooter or his/her equipment once the shooter is on the firing line.

Time: Two and one-half (2½) MINUTES per bank of five (5) targets.

Match Supervisor: Dwayne Richardson, Brownwood, Tx.

Light Rifle Match

Location: Texas 4-H Center, Lakeside Rifle Range

Targets: A-32 Light Rifle Targets

Course of Fire: Twenty (20) record shots will be fired using one (1) target with five (5) bulls, four (4) shots per bull. Unlimited sighters may be fired on the one (1) sighting bull. Total time, including sighters, will be thirty (30) MINUTES (one and one-half MINUTES per record shot). **All shots will be fired from the standing position.** The same standing position as used in three-position shooting may be used.

Equipment: Current 4-H Rifle Rules (NRA Provisional Light Rifle Rules) apply. Any .22 caliber rim-fire rifle chambered for the .22 short, long or long rifle cartridge, having a trigger pull of no less than a two (2) pounds and a total weight not more than eight and one-half (8½) pounds including sights. Telescopic sights may be used. No shooting jackets allowed. Shooters must furnish their own equipment and ammunition. **Semi-automatic rifles are permitted with adult supervision, but shooters are responsible for preventing their empties from interfering with other shooters, and the rifles must be loaded with a single cartridge at a time.** All rifles must an open bolt indicator (OBI) have in place when not being fired. Commercial or homemade red, orange, chartreuse or yellow OBIs are permitted. They must be in the action at all times except when on firing line.

Three-position Smallbore Rifle Match

Location: Texas 4-H Center, Lakeside Rifle Range

Targets: A-36 NRA Smallbore Target

Course of Fire: A quarter match course of fire will be used (10 shots each: prone, standing and kneeling). Shooters will have one (1) MINUTE per record shot fired prone, two (2) MINUTES per record shot standing, and one and one-half (1 ½) MINUTES per record shot fired kneeling, including unlimited sighters. **Juniors** will fire a 20-shot prone relay with one (1) MINUTE per record shot.

Rules: **NO SCOPES - open or iron sights only.**
All competition in this event is individual, therefore NO COACHING will be allowed after the match begins. Coaches may assist until sighters are complete. 4-H Smallbore Rifle Rules are in effect.

Equipment: Current 4-H Smallbore Rifle Rules and NRA Rule 3.2 apply. NOTE: Shooters using semi-automatic rifles must control their brass to avoid interference with other shooters AND may load only a single cartridge at a time

Match Supervisor: Gary Willhelm, Wickett, Tx.

Smallbore Rifle Silhouette Match

Location: Woodmen of the World Silhouette Range, off site of the Texas 4-H Center

Targets: Standard smallbore silhouettes

Course of Fire: All shooting from the standing position as follows:

	Junior	Intermediate	Senior
	10 pigs @ 40 yards	10 pigs @ 40 yards	10 chickens @ 40 yards
	10 rams @ 60yards	10 turkeys @ 60 yards	10 pigs @ 60 yards

Ties: Ties will be broken in three stages: totals in rams, turkeys, pigs and chickens; long runs in the same order, shoot offs using paper targets and air rifles on the air pistol range.

Equipment: 4-H Rifle Silhouette rules apply. Any safe smallbore rifle weighing up to 10 pounds 2 ounces with a safe trigger may be used. Any sights that do not project an image on the target are permitted. Rifles must be factory available. Butt plates must be centered with no more than 1.5 inches of comb elevation where adjustable stocks are used.

Coaching: Each shooter may have a coach or spotter on the firing line with a scope or binoculars to call shots, keep time and advise. They may not touch the shooter or his/her equipment once the shooter is on the firing line.

Time: Two and one-half (2½) MINUTES per bank of five (5) targets.

Match Supervisor: David Williams, Brookesmith, TX

Sporter and Precision Air Rifle Matches

Location: Texas 4-H Center, Lakeside Pavilion

Targets: AR 1/10, twelve (12) bull targets

Course of Fire: Sporter: Juniors - Ten shots each - two targets prone only.
Intermediates and Seniors - Ten (10) shots each - prone, standing and kneeling (in that order) for a total of 30 shots.

Precision: Juniors - Ten shots each - two targets, standing only.
Intermediate and Seniors - three targets, standing only.

Rules: Current National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules apply.

Equipment Classes: Sporter and Precision classes will be recognized. While shooters may be squaddled together and will shoot the same course of fire, only sporter rifles (up to an including the Daisy 853/753/953, Crossman 2000, and Daisy SXV40) are permitted in the sporter class. Precision air rifles allow anything beyond those models in price or set up. (See Rules above if in doubt.)

Equipment: **NO SCOPES PERMITTED.**
Any caliber .177 (4.5 mm) air rifle equipped with metallic sights or their equivalent, including precision air rifles are permitted. Slings may be used in the prone and kneeling stages. Shooting jackets, gloves and shooting boots are allowed ONLY in the Precision class. Adjustable stocks may not be altered between stages in the Sporter class. Two sweatshirts may be worn.

Time: One (1) minute per record shot, including sighters (30 minutes total). Relays are on 45 minute intervals.

Match Supervisor: Robert Clark, Del Rio, Tx.

For Shotgun events there is a \$15.00 range fee to be paid at the range. This one fee covers all events shot by a shooter on that range. Shooters registering for shotgun must make both of their two selections within shotgun and no other discipline due to the distance between the range and the 4-H Center for time consideration. A maximum of two shotgun events can be entered. The matches are restricted to entry level shooters ONLY.

Shotgun: Trap

Course: 25 shots

Equipment: Shotgun 12 gauge or smaller and target loads in sizes 7½ to 9 with no more than 1 1/8 ounces of shot.

Participation: 80 shooters maximum

Location: Pitt Range, Brownwood
Course: 25 shots
Equipment: Shotgun 12 gauge or smaller and target loads in sizes 7½ to 9 with no more than 1 1/8 ounces of shot.

Shotgun: Sporting Clays

Location: Pitt Range, Brownwood
Course: 25 shots
Equipment: Shotgun 12 gauge or smaller and target loads in sizes 7½ to 9 with no more than 1 1/8 ounces of shot.
Participation: 80 shooters maximum
Match Supervisor: Nelda Blackwell, Littlefield, Tx.

Hunting Medley

Location: Texas 4-H Center, Site to be announced
Events: Hunter Decision Making, Hunting Skills and Wildlife Identification (no live firing at this event)
Course: Participants will move through an established course, responding to the situations or questions posed. Approximately equal thirds of the course will be devoted to each of the events. This simulates the national and state events.
Equipment: Pencil or pen and official scorecard. All questions and situations will be based on the content of the 4-H Shooting Sports - Hunting Manual. No reference materials are permitted on the course.
