Eligibility: Participation in the State 4-H Indoor Archery Match is open to all Texas 4-H'ers that are enrolled in the Shooting Sports project for the current year. 4-H'ers must be under the supervision of the 4-H Certified archery coach that is listed on the registration document.

The 2020 Texas 4-H Indoor Archery Match will be held in five separate locations to accommodate 4-H archers across the state. Archers may shoot at any location but must choose only one and will compete for placings among all archers in all locations. Scores from all locations will be combined upon the completion of the last match to determine overall results. Archers may choose from the flight times offered at each location and will indicate their choice on their registration. Each flight will allow a maximum number of archers (Bay City: 60 per flight; Graham: 60 per flight; Fort Stockton: 34 per flight; Carrizo Springs: 50 per flight; Pampa: 32 per flight). The registration will control that limit on a first-come-first-served-basis with each flight becoming unavailable once the flight is full. **There will be no on-site registration or payment of any kind allowed at the events. Flights may not be added on-site, however withdrawals will be accepted.**

Flights: All flights are approximately 4 hours in length. **Arrive promptly at check-in time prior to the appropriate flight to go through equipment check, and mandatory orientation.**

- Thursday Evening, 5:00 p.m. check-in, shooting begins at 6:30 p.m. (Bay City ONLY)

- Friday Evening, 5:00 p.m. check-in, Shooting begins at 6:30 p.m.
- Saturday Morning, 7 a.m. check-in, Shooting begins at 8:30 a.m.
- Saturday Afternoon, 11:30 PM check-in, Shooting begins at 1:00 p.m.

Registration: Due to limited numbers of archers in each flight, it is recommended to register as soon as possible. Flights will close when the maximum limit of archers is reached on the registration process. Registration will be conducted by each individual shooter on 4-H Connect; (<https://texas.4honline.com>). **There will be no on-site registration or payment of any kind allowed at the events. Flights may NOT be added on-site, however withdrawals will be accepted.** Any actively enrolled 4-H member is eligible to participate (with county/club approval).

Registration Fees: \$35 Registration + \$5 Target Fee* = \$40 Total Fee per Equipment Class Entry (maximum of three classes per individual, **participants may NOT repeat the same equipment class**)

*Target Fee: this fee will be collected for the specific purpose of aiding in covering the costs of maintenance, repair, and replacement of the large number of target backs necessary to hold this event. Target Fees collected will only be used for this purpose.

Age Divisions:

1. Age Requirements

Youth may participate in 4-H year from September 1st of grade three through August 31st following completion of grade twelve, with these age restrictions:

- Minimum age - 8 (in addition to being in the 3rd grade)
- Maximum age - 18 (as of August 31, 2015)
- Special education youth who are older than 19 and have not graduated from high school may participate in 4-H Youth Development programs as members, with approval by the county Extension agent. Participation is limited to the club or county level. County Extension staff have the option, on a case-by-case basis, to allow Special Education youth older than 19 to participate in competitive events at the club or county level.

2. Texas 4-H Member Categories

- **Junior:** Grades 3, 4, and 5
- **Intermediate:** Grades 6, 7, and 8
- **Senior:** Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12
 - **Shooting Sports**
 - **Senior 1:** Grades 9 and 10
 - **Senior 2:** Grades 11 and 12

- ❖ Each age division will have a 'First Year' class open to anyone within the division that is new to archery (in their first year) and a first time shooter in this event. The 'First Year' class is for entry level archers. Entry in the 'First Year' class is optional. If this option is taken, the archer will be classified as a 'First Year' archer for every equipment class in which they register.

Course of Fire: The match consists of standard FITA (Federation of International Target Archery) targets (9 meter or 18 meter indoor rounds).



The 9 meter course will be set up for the Junior 'First Year' class ONLY and will consist of 10 ends of 3 arrows each (30 arrows total; 300 points possible).

The 18 meter course will be set up for all age divisions Junior through Sr. and 'First Year' classes within Intermediate, and Sr. and will consist of 20 ends of 3 arrows each (60 arrows total; 600 points possible). There will be a brief break between the 10th and 11th ends.

Targets: Recurve, Barebow, and NASP archers will compete on the 60 cm FITA face and all compound archers will compete on the 40 cm FITA face. The use of 3 Spot targets is the option of the shooter and must be declared with enough time to provide the appropriate target on the range.

Equipment Classes: Barebow, Recurve, Compound Aided, Compound Unaided, and NASP (National Archery in Schools Program). Archers may register in up to three equipment classes if they so choose.

- Bare Bow (longbow or recurve) – Bows may not be equipped with sights or sighting marks. Mechanical release aids are not permitted. Kisser buttons are not permitted; cushion plungers are not permitted.
- Recurve – Bows may be equipped with a single sighting device, single pin, multiple pin, or hunting style sights; may not be equipped with string peeps or string marks for rear sights. Mechanical release aids are not permitted.
- Compound Aided – Bows may be equipped with magnified sights and stabilizers. Mechanical release aids are permitted. Bows MAY NOT be equipped with any electronic devices.
- Compound Unaided – Bows may not be equipped with magnified sights or stabilizers. Bows may be equipped with single pin or multiple pin sights. Mechanical release aids are not permitted. Kisser Buttons and string peeps are not permitted.
- NASP – Genesis bows with no sights or sighting marks and no stabilizers. Mechanical release aids are not permitted. Shooters must follow 4-H age divisions and match rules. Original Genesis bows only. No "Genesis Mini's", or "Genesis Pros". Only Easton 1820 30" arrows are allowed in this class. This class is utilizing NASP equipment only.

It is strongly recommended that archers choosing to enter more than one equipment class shoot them on separate days if possible.

Scoring: Targets are to be scored by the shooters only, with assistance from the range officials if necessary. Scores and totals should be verified by each shooter before arrows are touched or removed from the target. Any question of scoring should be resolved before any arrow is touched or removed from the target.

Coaching: Remember, there is no coaching allowed when archers are on the line.

Awards: The results from each location will be compiled into one awards posting which will be posted on the Texas 4-H Natural Resources Program blog (<http://tx4hnaturalresources.blogspot.com>), Facebook (<http://www.facebook.com/tx4hnaturalresources>), and webpage (<http://texas4-h.tamu.edu/shootingsports/events>). Awards will be given for 1st through 3rd in each age division, including 'First Year', in each equipment class. Results may

not be available for any flight or event until the Match is complete and scores are compiled. Results will only be available via online postings.

Adult Representation: All shooters at this event must be accompanied by an adult who is responsible for the 4-H shooter. The responsible adult must be present during the time the 4-H shooter is actively shooting.

Dress Code: All shooters must wear closed toed shoes and shirts must have sleeves. All other standard 4-H Dress Code rules apply.
