

TEXAS 4-H ROUNDUP ROBOTICS CHALLENGE INVITATIONAL – INTENT TO COMPETE APPLICATION



The Robotics Challenge Invitational will be held on Tuesday, June 6 at Texas 4-H Roundup. This contest is designed to allow members to demonstrate their robotics, engineering, and problem-solving skills. It is intended for intermediate and senior teams who are capable of designing, building, programming, testing, and trouble-shooting a robot with no adult assistance.

Starting **Tuesday, April 11 at 6 pm (CST)** teams can submit their ***Intent to Compete*** application online at the link below. The application will remain open until April 18 at 6pm. The form will not be active until this date and time.

PLEASE READ THE BELOW INFORMATION CAREFULLY BEFORE REGISTERING.

1. This application process is intended for teams that are fully committed to competing at Roundup.
2. At the time of submission, everyone on the team must be an active (enrolled) 4-H member for the 2016-2017 year and be active in the 4-H robotics project.
3. Only one representative per team needs to complete this form. The representative can be a 4-H member, leader, parent, or County Extension Agent.
4. Limited to one intermediate and one senior team per county. No junior (3rd-5th grade) members allowed in this contest. A total of 36 teams (18 Senior and 18 Intermediate) will be accepted based on this first-come, first-served entry process.
5. A team must consist of 3 to 5 members. Team members listed can change between the form submission and Roundup registration.
6. Completing this form does not constitute automatic acceptance nor is it an official entry in Texas 4-H Roundup.
7. We will use the system's (Qualtrics) date and time stamp as the official moment of submission.
8. All submissions will be sorted by its date/time stamps to determine the first 18 teams in each age division.
9. Following the sign-up period, accepted teams will be notified with instructions on how to officially register all team members for this contest on 4-H Connect.
10. Each team that submits this form will be contacted via email to notify if they have been accepted as 1 of the 18 teams or their alternate order (1st alternate, 2nd alternate, etc.).
11. If for some reason a selected team withdraws from registering for Roundup, we will contact the next alternate team in line to fill our 36 total teams.
