



Global Leadership Opportunities Beyond Education

Project Description

GLOBE involves four citizenship and leadership experiences that allow 4-H members to explore culture, poverty, sustainable agricultural practices and service-learning. It is a year-long program for youth in grades 7-11.

Youth respond to this experience by identifying issues and conducting a service project in their own community. Webinars are held throughout the year to continue the learning process.

Basic

- The first level of involvement in GLOBE is called "Tier I."
- Youth learn through a poverty simulation experience in the Global Communities Project at the Texas 4-H Center in Brownwood, Texas.
- The second face-to-face program in Tier I is a "Day of Service" in a selected city or community. Youth work beside community members to resolve an identified crisis or need. The day is completed by field trips to local community resource agencies.

Intermediate

- The second level of involvement in GLOBE is called "Tier II."
- Tier II culminates the GLOBE experience in Costa Rica for service activities, tours of local agricultural enterprises, wild animal conservation, tours of the rainforest to study environmental impact, and exciting ecotourism adventures.

Where:

There are four project learning experiences in GLOBE:

1. Virtual experience
2. Tier I experience of Global Communities Project at Texas 4-H Center in Brownwood
3. Tier I Day of Service in selected city or community (varies year to year)
4. Tier II experience in Costa Rica

When:

- Estimated costs per youth for the year-long experience is \$2,700
- Application process is online
- Applications open annually around September and the selected cohort is announced around October
- The Global Simulation is typically in October, the Day of Service is typically in January, and the Costa Rica trip is typically in July.

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Did you know?

4-H is a club for kids and teens to develop life skills and make friends. Youth can join 4-H in all 254 counties. Everybody ages 8-18 and in 3rd-12th grades can join 4-H. Kids in Kindergarten to 2nd grades can join as Clover Kids. There are 43 different project areas in five project categories: Agriculture & Livestock, Family & Community Health, Leadership & Citizenship, Natural Resources, and STEM.
