

Rabbit Extravaganza

Event Description

The Extravaganza is a State-wide educational event and competition that is organized and hosted by the Texas 4-H Rabbit Advisory Board. The event is open to enrolled Texas 4-H members of official 4-H age. The Extravaganza will include: a single Youth Rabbit Show, Youth Skill Contests, Art & Crafts, and Educational Workshops on the 4-H Rabbit Project.

Through the 4-H Rabbit project, youth will learn about the basics of how to care for a rabbit, including proper nutrition, and how to show rabbits. Youth aLao experience the full process of selecting, feeding, breeding, and marketing rabbits, and learn public speaking, leadership, and community service through caring for rabbits. The Rabbit Extravaganza furthers the learning opportunities for all of those skills.

Basic

- Youth will learn the basics of raising and presenting breeding and market rabbits for show.
- CLOVER KIDS will a special noncompetitive division for best dressed rabbit and showmanship..
- Educational workshops include
 - Meet the Breeds
 - Mani/Pedi Grooming Clinic
 - Learning More About the Rabbit Extravaganza
 - Showmanship & Meat Pens

Advanced

- After competing for several years, youth will grow in their confidence and ability to raise quality rabbits.
- Youth may participate in leadership positions at the event or with the advisory board.
