

Texas 4-H Roundup

Event Description

Texas 4-H Roundup is the pinnacle event of the state 4-H program. The event consists of approximately 50 competitive events, with some of these contests requiring each individual or team to qualify at the county and district level to compete. Senior level (9th-12th grade) 4-H members participate at this event, which also holds scholarship recognition, retiring of the State 4-H Council, educational workshops, a trade show, and high energy assemblies..

In this event, youth will gain self esteem and confidence, build communication skills, learn responsibility, and practice teamwork. Additionally, youth will network and develop the ability to make lasting connections.

Basic and advanced involvement

- Each year contests are held at the County, District, and then State levels to test a 4-H member's knowledge of the skills they have learned through their projects.
- Contests at Roundup are designed to supplement the county 4-H program.
- This event provides learning opportunities in the areas of Agriculture & Livestock, Family & Community Health, Leadership & Citizenship, Natural Resources and STEM.
