

Texas 4-H Leadership Conference

The Texas 4-H Leadership Conference in Washington, D.C., is an educational 1

program that offers young participants from the Texas 4-H organization the opportunity to engage in a leadership-focused experience in the nation's capital. Senior 4-H members who win first place at the Texas 4-H Record Book Judging competition will register through 4HOnline.

During this conference, attendees learn about leadership, citizenship, and community service through a series of activities, tours, and interactive sessions.

Participation includes:

- Visits to various landmarks, memorials, museums, and historical sites in and around Washington, D.C.
- Participants get to explore the rich history and significance of the United States while also gaining insights into leadership principles.
- Activities and details may vary from year to year, but the overall aim of the Texas 4-H Leadership Conference in Washington, D.C., is to provide young individuals with a valuable and immersive experience that enhances their understanding of leadership, civic engagement, and the nation's history.

• Texas 4-H Leadership Conference is held annually in Washington, D.C. and the surrounding area.

When:

• Texas 4-H Leadership Conference is held annually during Thanksgiving break - participants fly out on Thanksgiving day and return the following Tuesday.

• ONLY State record book winners will earn the opportunity to attend the Texas 4-H Leadership Conference. Cost of the trip to the 4-H member is typically between \$1,500 - \$2,000.

Did you know?

4-H is a club for kids and teens to develop life skills and make friends. Youth can join 4-H in all 254 counties. Everybody ages 8-18 and in 3rd-12th grades can join 4-H. Kids in Kindergarten to 2nd grades can join as Clover Kids. There are 43 different project areas in five project categories: Agriculture & Livestock, Family & Community Health, Leadership & Citizenship, Natural Resources, and STEM.
