

Shooting Sports Extravaganza

Event Description

If you're new to shooting sports, this is the place to start! The Shooting Sports Extravaganza is a beginner's match and learning event. Beginner shooters will learn the process of shooting competitively, basic knowledge of firearm and range safety, and about the shooting sports events.

Ages: open to grades 3-5, 6-8, and 9-12.

Involvement

- This is a beginner's match and a learning event only. Rules are adjusted to accommodate this being a beginner's match. There are rules in place THAT ARE SPECIFIC to this event! For example: There are NO releases allowed in the Basic Archery event.
- This is an event for beginner shooters to learn the processes of shooting competitively. Basic knowledge of firearm safety, range safety, event rules, and event format is required. No previous competitive participation is required. The emphasis is on exploring new shooting activities and having fun.
- Any enrolled 4-H member who is active in a 4-H Shooting Sports project under the direct supervision of a 4-H Shooting Sports Coach certified in the applicable discipline(s) (Archery, Rifle, Pistol, Shotgun) is eligible to participate in this event (with County/Club approval).

Where:

The Annual Texas 4-H Shooting Sports Extravaganza will take place at the Texas 4-H Conference Center on Lake Brownwood.

When:

The event will take place in the spring, typically in April.

Did you know?

4-H is a club for kids and teens to develop life skills and make friends. Youth can join 4-H in all 254 counties. Everybody ages 8-18 and in 3rd-12th grades can join 4-H. Kids in Kindergarten to 2nd grades can join as Clover Kids. There are 43 different project areas in five project categories: Agriculture & Livestock, Family & Community Health, Leadership & Citizenship, Natural Resources, and STEM.
