


State Dog Show

The Texas 4-H Dog Show specifically focuses on dog-related activities and competitions involving 4-H members and their dogs. Participants may compete in various categories, such as obedience, showmanship, rally, and more, depending on the specific rules and events organized by the Texas 4-H program.

The Texas 4-H Dog Show is a competitive event where 4-H youth take their dogs to be evaluated and judged according to standards set by the AKC.

Knowledge and skills gained through participation

- Public Speaking and Presentation Learn to talk to judges, peers and other public figures,.
- Goal Setting: Participants set goals for themselves and their dogs, such as achieving specific training milestones or earning awards in different categories. This encourages goal-setting and planning skills.
- Sportsmanship Competing in dog shows provides an opportunity to learn about good sportsmanship.
 Participants learn how to handle both victories and defeats graciously and respectfully.
- Life Skills Beyond the specifics of dog care and training, participants develop life skills such as patience, discipline, perseverance, and empathy through their experiences with their canine companions



MORE ABOUT STATE 4-H DOG SHOW

Who:

- The Texas 4-H Dog Show is open to youth who are 8 years old and in the 3rd grade (as of September 1st)
- Clover Kids (K- 2nd graders) may participate in the dog care and training project, but are not allowed to compete.

Where:

 The show is held annually in July and rotates to different counties

When:

• Occurs on the 2nd weekend in July - Thursday - Saturday

Registration information:

- Registration for the state show is open in April and May
- All dogs must be validated through the 4-H Online System to be eligible to participate in the dog show
- Dogs not validated, may be eligible for the Foster/Family project option
- There is a also a dog photography contest available to enter

Did you know?

4-H is a club for kids and teens to develop life skills and make friends. Youth can join 4-H in all 254 counties. Everybody ages 8-18 and in 3rd-12th grades can join 4-H. Kids in Kindergarten to 2nd grades can join as Clover Kids. There are 43 different project areas in five project categories: Agriculture & Livestock, Family & Community Health, Leadership & Citizenship, Natural Resources, and STEM.
