<b>Sit</b> - dog is to drop his hindquarters to the ground and remain propped upright on his front legs	Dog did not make it all the way to the ground. Dog did not maintain the sitting position. Dog did not sit on first command or was forced to sit.	
<b>Fast</b> - Obvious increase in pace	No obvious change in pace	
<b>Slow</b> - Obvious decrease in pace	No obvious change in pace	
<b>Left Turn</b> - 90 degree turn to the left	Tugging on leash	
<b>Right Turn</b> - 90 degree turn to the left	Tugging on leash	
<b>About Turn</b> - 180 degree turn in either direction to continue in the true opposite direction	Tugging on leash	
<b>Sit Stay</b> - dog is to drop his hindquarters to the ground and remain propped upright on his front legs. Dog will remain in this position until released.	Did not remain in place, repeated whines or barks, stood or laid down before handler returns. Movement after handler returns. Dog did not sit on first command or was forced to sit.	
<b>Down Stay</b> - dog will drop either to sphinx position or laid over on side. Dog will remain in this position until released.	Did not remain in place, repeated whines or barks, stood or sat upright before handler returns. Movement after handler returns. Dog did not sit on first command or was forced to lay.	
<b>Recall</b> - The handler will sit the dog and leave. The handler will call their dog by either voice or hand signal (but not both). The dog should come directly to the front of the handler.	Attempts to guide the dog in the "come". Failure of dog to come on first command or signal, no sit in front, tight leash, did not extend to full length of leash. Using the dog's name as part of the spoken command if a hand signal is also used (Double command).	
<b>Finish</b> - The handler will use either a voice or hand signal so that the dog moves back to heel position.	Attempts to guide the dog in the "finish", no finish, extra command to finish.	
<b>Stand for Exam</b> - The handler will stand his dog and leave when ready. A voice command and hand signal may be used.	Using the dog's name as part of the spoken command if a hand signal is also used (Double command). Sits or lies down, moves feet, sits as handler returns, leash on floor/too much slack, tight leash
