OVERVIEW

The Texas 4-H Roundup Archery Match will be held the week of State 4-H Roundup. **This will be a 30 target, 3-D Match.** There will be one (1) start time. This contest will allow a maximum of 100 archers. Registration, Location, & Date are located below. Directions and any other pertinent information for shooters and their parents will be posted on the Texas 4-H Shooting Sports page as well as emailed to participants.

In 4-H events, 4-H rules and regulations supersede all other rules where differences exist. Archers, as well as Coaches and parents, are encouraged to be familiar with these rules. Remember, to participate in the Roundup Archery event, the 4-H'er must be enrolled in the shooting sports project and be shooting under a 4-H certified coach. Age Division- Senior (Grades 9-12) as of September 1, 2025.

EQUIPMENT CLASSES

Barebow, Recurve, Compound Aided, Compound Unaided, & NASP (National Archery in Schools Program). **Archers may register in only one equipment class.**

- **Bare Bow (longbow or recurve)** – Bows may not be equipped with sights or sighting marks. Must not have kisser buttons, peep sights, or cushion plungers. Mechanical release aids are not permitted. Bows may have weights added but they must be in compliance with USA Shooting rules.
- **Recurve** – Bows may be equipped with a single sighting device, single pin; may not be equipped with string peeps or string marks for rear sights. Mechanical release aids are not permitted.
- **Compound Aided** – Bows may be equipped with magnified sights and stabilizers. Mechanical release aids are permitted. No laser, range finding, or holographic sights are permitted.
- **Compound Unaided** – Bows may not be equipped with magnified sights or stabilizers. Bows may be equipped with single pin or multiple pin sights. Mechanical release aids are not permitted. NO peep sights will be allowed in this class.
- **NASP – Original** Genesis bows (NO Genesis Pros or minis) with no sights or sighting marks and no stabilizers. Mechanical release aides are not permitted. Shooters must follow 4-H age divisions and match rules. This class utilizes NASP equipment only (arrow size, etc.).

LOCATION & DATE

The contest will take place on Tuesday, June 2nd, 2026 beginning at 8:00 am. Archery range will be located at 1715 Louis Street in Bryan, TX. Please plan accordingly as the range is approximately 20-25 minutes from Texas A&M University Campus.

REGISTRATION

Registration for this contest will be through **4HOnline - Texas 4-H Roundup Event.**

*There will be NO on-site registration or payment of any kind allowed at the event.

SCORING

Targets will be scored utilizing the 4-H scoring system in place for the Texas State Games (Archery). Totals of each end should be verified by each shooter before arrows are touched or removed from the target. All additions on the scorecard will be done by the scorers ONLY. This will be strictly enforced. Any questions of scoring should be resolved before any arrow is touched or removed from the target. **ALL SCORECARDS SHALL BE SCORED WITH THE END SCORE AND THE RUNNING SCORE BEFORE LEAVING THE TARGET AT THE CONCLUSION OF EACH END.**

AWARDS

Top 3 places in each bow class will be given during the State Roundup award ceremony. 4th and 5th place medals will be awarded in each bow class after the top 3 have been announced.

DISTANCE

This will be an “unknown distance” match.

ADULT REPRESENTATION

All shooters at this event must be accompanied by an adult who is responsible for the 4-H shooter.

DRESS CODE

All shooters must wear long pants and closed-toe shoes, and shirts must have sleeves. All other standard 4-H Dress Code rules apply.

RANGE FINDERS

NO range finding devices will be permitted.

NOTE:

NO Electronic devices of any sort will be permitted on the shooting line. This includes cell phones, or any version of ear devices.
