The archery discipline will take place at the Kerr County Extension Office and is approx. 10 miles from the Hill Country Shooting Sports Range. Make sure you have transportation. In addition, the Waiver, and Covid Screening Form is attached that is required to participate. Please print the form, complete and sign it, **and bring the original signed form with you to turn in at check-in on Saturday morning.**

If you are a Youth Assistant Coach Candidate, you will need to bring the original signed copy of the Assistant Coach Acknowledgement Youth Form with you in addition to the Waiver, Indemnification and Medical Treatment Form to turn in on that Saturday morning.

At this time, a COVID screening form will also need to be completed and brought to the training.

Lodging:

Lodging is on your own at this training. Various lodging options are available in the area.

What to Take As a Training Participant:

Everyone attending should take the following:

- 3-ring binder (2" or larger recommended)
- writing materials and extra paper for notes
- highlighters if you use them for emphasizing curriculum information
- eye protection (shooting glasses or goggles) – recommended for archery, mandatory for all other disciplines
- ear protection (plugs or muffs) -mandatory for shotgun, rifle, and pistol disciplines
- closed toed shoes
- comfortable outdoor clothing, including a cap or hat suitable for the prevailing weather and be prepared for inclement weather
- sunscreen
- range chairs if desired
- snacks and drinks between meals if desired
- open mind ready to learn and share

Shotgun discipline participants:

- 20 or 12 gauge shotgun, any action type
- Ammunition pouch or vest
- Ammunition will be provided at the training

Archery discipline participants:

- Some shooting equipment will be provided at the training
- Personal bows should be taken and used at the discretion of the Instructor

Rifle discipline participants:

- Some shooting equipment will be provided at the training
- Personal rifles may be taken and used at the discretion of the Instructor
- Ammunition will be provided at the training

Pistol discipline participants:

- Some shooting equipment will be provided at the training

- Personal pistols may be taken and used at the discretion of the Instructor
- Ammunition will not be provided at the training due to the variety of firearms.

Muzzleloading participants:

- Some shooting equipment will be provided at the training
- Personal muzzleloaders are encouraged
- Ammunition may be provided at the training

Hunting and Wildlife participants:

- Some shooting equipment will be provided, however, you are encouraged to bring a .22 caliber rifle, a bow, and a shotgun that can be used in a double shot situation.
- Ammunition will be provided at the training for .22 caliber rifles, and 12 and 20 gauge shotguns.

Western Heritage:

- shooting equipment will be provided
- **Please dress as “Western” as you can.** This discipline has an extensive history component. Part of that component is period dress.
