

State 4-H Roundup Archery Rules

The Texas 4-H Roundup Archery Match will be held during Texas State 4-H Roundup. <u>This will be a 30 target, 3-D</u> <u>Match.</u> There will be one (1) start time. This contest will allow a maximum of 100 archers. Registration will be through 4-H Connect for "State Roundup. **There will be no on-site registration or payment of any kind allowed at the event.** The contest will take place on Tuesday, June 4th, 2024 during Texas State 4-H Roundup beginning at 8:00 AM. Directions and other pertinent information for shooters and their parents will be posted on the Texas 4-H Shooting Sports webpage as well as emailed to participants.

In 4-H events, <u>4-H</u> rules and regulations supersede all other rules where differences exist. Archers, as well as Coaches and parents, are encouraged to be familiar with these rules. Remember, to participate in the Roundup Archery event, the 4-H'er <u>must</u> be enrolled in the shooting sports project <u>and</u> be shooting under a 4-H certified coach. Age Divisions: Participants will compete individually within their age division determined as of September 1, 2024.

• Senior – 9th thru 12th grades

Equipment Classes: Barebow, Recurve, Compound Aided, Compound Unaided, and NASP (National Archery in Schools Program). Archers may only register in one equipment class.

- Bare Bow (longbow or recurve) Bows may not be equipped with sights or sighting marks. Must not have kisser buttons, peep sights, or cushion plungers. Mechanical release aids are <u>not</u> permitted. Bows may have weights added, but must be in compliance with <u>USA Shooting</u> rules.
- Recurve Bows may be equipped with a single sighting device, single pin; may not be equipped with string peeps or string marks for rear sights. Mechanical release aids are <u>not</u> permitted.
- Compound Aided Bows may be equipped with magnified sights and stabilizers. Mechanical release aids are permitted. No laser, range finding, or holographic sights permitted.
- Compound Unaided Bows may not be equipped with magnified sights or stabilizers. Bows may be
 equipped with single pin or multiple pin sights. Mechanical release aids are <u>not</u> permitted. NO peep sights
 will be allowed in this class.
- NASP *Original* Genesis bows (NO Genesis Pros or mini's) with no sights or sighting marks and no stabilizers. Mechanical release aides are <u>not</u> permitted. Shooters must follow 4-H age divisions and match rules. This class is utilizing NASP equipment only (arrow size, etc.).



Scoring: Targets will be scored utilizing the 4-H scoring system in place for the Texas State Games (Archery). Totals of each end should be verified by each shooter before arrows are touched or removed from the target. All addition on the scorecard will be done by the scorers ONLY. This will be strictly enforced. Any question of scoring should be resolved before any arrow is touched or removed from the target. ALL SCORECARDS SHALL BE SCORED WITH THE END SCORE AND THE RUNNING SCORE BEFORE LEAVING THE TARGET AT THE CONCLUSION OF EACH END.

Awards: Top three places in each bowclass will be given during the State Roundup award ceremony. 4th and 5th place medals will be awarded in each bowclass after the top 3 have been announced.

Distance: This will be an "unknown distance" match.

Adult Representation: All shooters at this event must be accompanied by an adult who is responsible for the 4-H shooter.

Dress Code: All shooters must wear long pants and closed toed shoes, and shirts must have sleeves. All other standard 4-H Dress Code rules apply.

Range Finders: NO range finding devices will be permitted.

NOTE:

NO Electronic devices of any sort will be permitted on the shooting line. This includes cell phones, or any version of ear devices.

Range:

Range is located at 1715 Louis Street in Bryan, Texas. It is approximately 20-25 minutes from the Texas A&M University Campus. Please plan accordingly.
